DEVICES

WHEREAS, Section 52 of the Charter of the City of Garfield Heights permits this Council to submit proposed Charter amendments to the electors of the City upon a Council vote of two-thirds in favor of said change, and

WHEREAS, an affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of Council members present shall result in this amendment to be presented to the electors of the City on the November 8, 2022, General Election, and

WHEREAS, the Garfield Heights Charter Review Committee, pursuant to Section 57 of the Garfield Heights Charter, has reviewed the Charter of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio, has recommended to Council the repealing of Section 59 of the Garfield Heights Charter relating to traffic law photo-monitoring devices, and

WHEREAS, the Council wishes to provide for said amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio that:

SECTION 1. Section 59 of the Garfield Heights Charter relating to traffic photo-monitoring devices shall be repealed in its entirety:

~~59-1. The City, including its various Boards, agencies and departments, shall not use any traffic law photo-monitoring device for the enforcement of a qualified traffic law violation, unless a law enforcement officer is present at the location of the device and personally issues the ticket to the alleged violator at the time and location of the violation.~~

~~59-2. Definitions. As used in this Section 59:~~

~~a) "Law enforcement officer" means any law enforcement officer employed by the City or any other political jurisdiction in Ohio, including the State. The City may from time to time and in its discretion, by ordinance or resolution, designate which City employees are, "law enforcement officers" for purposes of this Section 59.~~

~~b) "Qualified law traffic violation" means a violation of any of the following: (1) any state or local law relating to complying with a traffic control signal or railroad crossing sign or signal; or~~

~~(2) any state or local law limiting the speed of a motor vehicle.~~

~~c) "Ticket" means any traffic ticket, citation, summons, or other notice of liability (whether civil or criminal) issued in response to an alleged qualified traffic law violation detected by a traffic law photo-monitoring device.~~

~~d) "Traffic law photo-monitoring device" means an electronic system consisting of a photographic, video, or electronic camera and a means of sensing~~

~~the presence of a motor vehicle that automatically produces photographs, videotape, or digital images of the vehicle, its license plate or its operator.~~

~~59-3. Any ordinance enacted prior to the passage of this Amendment that contravenes any of the foregoing is void. After the enactment of this Amendment, the City shall not enact or enforce any ordinance that contravenes any of the foregoing. In the event that any provision of this Section 59 is found to be unconstitutional or impermissibly in conflict with state or federal law, only such provision found to be unconstitutional or impermissible will be stricken, and the remainder of this Section 59 will remain in full force and effect.~~

SECTION 2. The proposed amendment to Section 59 of the Garfield Heights Charter shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electorate of the City of Garfield Heights at an election to be held November 8, 2022 during the regular hours of voting permitted as prescribed by law, where a majority affirmative vote is required for passage.

SECTION 3. The Law Director is hereby directed to transmit by certified mail a certified copy of this Ordinance and the following ballot language to the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections, c/o the Director's Office, located at 2925 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio 44115 and/or to hand-deliver the same to the Issues Department located on the Third Floor of the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections and obtain a written and dated receipt therefore and he is further directed to make the necessary arrangements with the Board of Elections, Cuyahoga County, for giving notice of the proposed amendment of the municipal Charter and for compliance with other regulations including but not limited to appropriate ballot language in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE ELECTORATE OF AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 41 OF THE GARFIELD HEIGHTS CHARTER, PROVIDING FOR THE MAYOR TO SERVE AS THE PUBLIC SAFETY DIRECTOR

WHEREAS, Section 52 of the Charter of the City of Garfield Heights permits this Council to submit proposed Charter amendments to the electors of the City upon a Council vote of two-thirds in favor of said change, and

WHEREAS, an affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of Council members present shall result in this amendment to be presented to the electors of the City on the November 8, 2022, General Election, and

WHEREAS, the Garfield Heights Charter Review Committee, pursuant to Section 57 of the Garfield Heights Charter, has reviewed the Charter of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio, has recommended to Council amending Section 41 of the Garfield Heights Charter providing for the Mayor to serve as the Public Safety Director, and

WHEREAS, the Council wishes to provide for said amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio that:

SECTION 1. Section 41 of the Garfield Heights Charter shall be amended as follows:

The Department of Public Safety shall be in the charge of the Safety Director. There shall be in the Department of Public Safety a Police Division and a Fire Division. There shall be in the Department of Public Safety a Division of Building, Engineering and Inspection. **The Mayor shall serve as Safety Director.**

41-A Annual rate of pay to be paid members of the police division. The annual rate of compensation for the members of the police division, Department of Public Safety, shall be no less than the average that is paid to members of police divisions in the suburban cities with a population of ten thousand (10,000) or more whose boundary lines are contiguous to the City of Cleveland.

On or about the first day of April of each year, the Council shall cause a survey to be made as to the rate of compensation paid to members of the police divisions of suburban cities whose population is ten thousand (10,000) or more, whose boundary lines are contiguous to the City of Cleveland, based upon the latest federal decennial census. Not later than the first day of June of each year, Council shall enact legislation providing for the payment of a rate of compensation for the members of the police division not less than the average compensation paid to the aforementioned suburban cities, which such rate of compensation shall become effective on and shall be paid from the first day of June of that year.

The expression "rate of compensation" or pay, as used in this section, shall apply only to a basic amount of wages and does not include such benefits as

might be set up by any city by way of holidays, vacations, other permitted absences, overtime, longevity, night or split shifts, pay for specialized service within a classification or rank, or other premium pay differentials or any type whatsoever. The foregoing enumeration is not exclusive; it is the intent of this section that nothing other than a basic amount of wages, with included range scales, be included within the meaning of "rate of compensation" or pay.

Upon passage of this Charter Amendment, a special survey shall be made in accordance with the hereinbefore stated provisions, and the new rate shall be paid beginning January 1, 1973.

For the purpose of this section, the pay ranges of 1971 shall be considered as a base. Such additional funds as shall be required by the operation of this Section in addition to the 1971 base, shall be generated by an increase in the limitation on the rate of taxation as provided in Section 21 of this Charter.

Council is hereby authorized to increase the limitation on the rate of taxation by such millage as shall be needed to realize the funds required.

41-B Annual rate of pay to be paid members of the fire division. The annual rate of compensation for members of the fire division, Department of Public Safety, shall be no less than the average that is paid to members of the fire divisions in the suburban cities with a population of ten thousand (10,000) or more whose boundary lines are contiguous to the City of Cleveland.

On or about the first day of April of each year, the Council shall cause a survey to be made as to the rate of compensation paid to members of the fire divisions of suburban cities whose population is ten thousand (10,000) or more, whose boundary lines are contiguous to the City of Cleveland, based upon the latest Federal decennial census. Not later than the first day of June of each year, Council shall enact legislation providing for the payment of a rate of compensation for the members of the fire department not less than the average compensation paid to the aforementioned suburban cities, which such rate of compensation shall become effective on and shall be paid from the first day of June of that year.

The expression "rate of compensation" or pay, as used in this section, shall apply only to a basic amount of wages and does not include such benefits as might be set up by any city by way of holidays, vacations, other permitted absences, overtime, longevity, night or split shifts, pay for specialized service within a classification or rank, or other premium pay differentials or any type whatsoever. The foregoing enumeration is not exclusive; it is the intent of this section that nothing other than a basic amount of wages, with included range scales, be included within the meaning of "rate of compensation" or pay.

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Council is hereby authorized to increase the limitation on the rate of taxation by such millage as shall be needed to realize the funds required.

SECTION 2. The proposed amendment to Section 41 of the Garfield Heights Charter shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electorate of the City of Garfield Heights at an election to be held

November 8, 2022 during the regular hours of voting permitted as prescribed by law, where a majority affirmative vote is required for passage.

SECTION 3. The Law Director is hereby directed to transmit by certified mail a certified copy of this Ordinance and the following ballot language to the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections, c/o the Director's Office, located at 2925 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio 44115 and/or to hand-deliver the same to the Issues Department located on the Third Floor of the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections and obtain a written and dated receipt therefore and he is further directed to make the necessary arrangements with the Board of Elections, Cuyahoga County, for giving notice of the proposed amendment of the municipal Charter and for compliance with other regulations including but not limited to appropriate ballot language in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code.

WHEREAS, The City of Garfield Heights would like to purchase a used 2015 Freightliner M2-106 Forestry Bucket Truck to replace the City's current 1991 GMC Topkick Forestry Truck, and

WHEREAS, Altec Nueco, LLC is currently selling a 2015 Freightliner M2-106, with 44,730 miles, equipped with an Altec LR756 Articulating Overcenter Aerial Device with insulating lower and upper booms to reach a platform height of 56.3 feet and side reach of 44.4 feet, and

WHEREAS, the cost of a new forestry bucket truck is approximately \$275,000.00; the total cost of this vehicle will not exceed \$132,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. The Mayor, or his designee, is authorized and directed to enter into a purchase agreement with Altec Nueco, LLC to purchase a 2015 Freightliner Forestry Bucket Truck for a cost not to exceed \$132,000.00.

SECTION 2. The Finance Director is directed to issue her vouchers of the City for the purpose set forth in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 3. Council declares this Ordinance to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare and shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption by this Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

WHEREAS, Each year the City of Garfield Heights applies to receive funding available through the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant, and

WHEREAS, this year, the City wishes to apply for the grant jointly with Cuyahoga County and the cities of Cleveland, East Cleveland, Euclid, Cleveland Heights, and Parma, and

WHEREAS, in the event the City is awarded funding, the City intends to use the grant to purchase a barcoding system for labeling and managing evidence and (2) two ballistic entry shields.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN THE CITIES OF EAST CLEVELAND, EUCLID, PARMA, AND CLEVELAND HEIGHTS, CUYAHOGA COUNTY, AND THE CITY OF CLEVELAND.

Fiscal Year 2022 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant

This agreement is made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2022, by and among the cities of Euclid, Parma, Garfield Heights, and Cleveland Heights, Cuyahoga County, hereinafter referred to as JURISDICTIONS, and the City of Cleveland, hereinafter referred to as CLEVELAND, witnesseth:

WHEREAS, each governing body, in performing governmental functions of paying for the performance of governmental functions hereunder, shall make the performance of those payments from current revenues legally available to that party through a lump sum payment; and

WHEREAS, each governing body finds that the performance of this Agreement is in the best interests of all parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the division of costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions under this agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant is designed to provide additional personnel, equipment, supplies, contractual support, training, technical assistance, and information systems for the administration of criminal justice; and

WHEREAS, the JURISDICTIONS and CLEVELAND agree that CLEVELAND will be the Fiscal Agent for this grant; and

WHEREAS, CLEVELAND agrees to provide the JURISDICTIONS funding from the U.S Department of Justice Fiscal Year 2022 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (FY22 JAG) total award of \$690,022.00 for programs approved by the Bureau of Justice Assistance; and

WHEREAS, the JURISDICTIONS and CLEVELAND believe it to be in their best interest to allocate the FY22 JAG funds.

NOW THEREFORE, the JURISDICTIONS and CLEVELAND agree as follows:

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Section 1.

CLEVELAND will allocate a maximum of \$26,392.00 (5%) of their total FY22 JAG award for administrative purposes.

Section 2.

The JURISDICTIONS agree to use FY22 JAG funds not to exceed their individual allocation for expenses for the period October 1, 2021 until September 30, 2025.

Section 3.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against CLEVELAND or the JURISDICTIONS.

Section 4.

Each party to this Agreement will be responsible for providing services under this agreement, and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services for the other party.

Section 5.

The parties to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this Agreement.

Section 6.

By entering this Agreement, the parties do not intend to create any obligations expressed or implied other than those set out herein; further, this Agreement shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.

Section 7.

It is understood that the allocated funds shall be advanced to the JURISDICTIONS in a lump sum. With this transfer of funds, the JURISDICTIONS agree to abide by OMB 133 and the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs Financial Guide regarding the expenditure of funds, including submission of quarterly fiscal and quarterly program reports detailing how funds are expended under this agreement. CLEVELAND shall release funds within ninety (90) days after first draw down. All JURISDICTIONS will be notified upon receipt of the initial draw down of funds.

Section 8

This agreement may be modified whenever such modifications are deemed necessary by the mutual consent of CLEVELAND and the JURISDICTIONS. Any such modifications shall be in writing and signed by both parties.

WHEREAS, Current Ohio law requires local governments to pay costs and fees in advance when taking civil action to enforce traffic-camera citations (excluding citations issued in school zones), and

WHEREAS, the villages of Newburgh Heights and Walton Hills both issue traffic-camera citations that will may result in civil actions being filed in the Garfield Heights Municipal Court, and

WHEREAS, accordingly, the City must establish a fund for the Garfield Heights Municipal Court to manage the revenue from the traffic-camera citations.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. The Finance Director is hereby authorized and directed to establish the Municipal Court Traffic Camera Revenue Fund, number 230, within the City's budgetary fund structure.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE FINANCE DIRECTOR TO ESTABLISH THE ONEOHIO OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUND, NUMBER 224, WITHIN THE CITY'S BUDGETARY FUND STRUCTURE.

WHEREAS, Ohio reached an \$808 million agreement with the three largest distributors of opioids. The state developed the OneOhio plan, a mechanism to ensure that any money from a negotiated settlement is distributed fairly to the communities hit hardest by the opioid crisis, and

WHEREAS, the settlement agreement allocates 30% to local governments (LG Share), 55% to a foundation that will distribute funds to projects, and 15% to the Office of the Ohio Attorney General as Counsel for the State of Ohio, and

WHEREAS, Ohio Rev. Code §5705.09(F) requires subdivisions to establish separate funds for each class of revenue derived from a source other than the general property tax, which the law requires to be used for a particular purpose, and

WHEREAS, at this time, the City wishes to establish a OneOhio Opioid Settlement Fund in accordance with Ohio Rev. Code §5705.09(F) for the above-stated purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. The Finance Director is hereby authorized and directed to establish the OneOhio Opioid Settlement Fund, number 224, within the City's budgetary fund structure.

SECTION 2. Council declares this Ordinance to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation and protection of the public peace, health, safety, and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Garfield Heights and shall take effect and be in full force immediately upon its adoption by this Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH OHM ADVISORS TO PROVIDE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT / PLANNING SERVICES TO THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS FOR 2022, 2023 AND 2024.

WHEREAS, The City of Garfield Heights desires to enter into an agreement with OHM Advisors to provide Economic Development/Planning services to the City for 2022, 2023 and 2024, and

WHEREAS, this matter was brought before Council in Garfield Heights Ordinance 70-2022 and did not receive the requisite number of votes; as a result, this agreement has been renegotiated and is being resubmitted to Council for approval with the key amendment being that OHM has increased the amount of work hours provided to the City on a weekly-basis without any additional cost from the originally-proposed agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. 


