

# MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF

Mayor Burke and City Council members I would like to present to you the 2022 Annual Report for the Garfield Heights Police Department.

In 2022, our department made great strides regarding crime prevention, community engagement, and technological advances which all serve to strengthen our community. We set a goal almost three years ago to create a specialized unit that could focus on proactive crime deterrence and addressing quality of life issues for residents. The most important resource needed to create this unit was four more officers. In 2022 we met our staffing goal of 54 officers and in June were able to create our Targeted Enforcement Unit.

Going along with this, our department hired seven new officers in 2022. Some were to reach our 54 officer goal and some were to replace officers who were retiring. All officers were lateral transfers from other police departments with at least one year of full-time experience. All new officers have been fully trained and are currently on solo patrol.

In March, the State of Ohio began accepting proposals for a grant called the ARPA Violence Reduction Grant aimed to assist departments in several categories including strategies to combat violent crime and hiring and retaining officers. Our department worked hard on our own proposal and in September we were notified that we had been awarded just over \$1.3 Million in funding. The funding will be allocated for license plate readers, citywide surveillance cameras, crime analysis software, our drone program, and officer retention bonuses. We were also awarded \$74,000 to upgrade and replace our body-worn cameras through a separate grant. We expect to receive the awarded funds early in 2023.

We had multiple promotions occur throughout the year as well. In February, Dale Merchant was promoted to Captain and appointed Deputy Chief, William Gall was promoted to Captain, Vinson Walker was promoted to Lieutenant, and Tim Baon was promoted to Sergeant. Then in April, Robert Jarzemba was promoted to Lieutenant and Spencer Sabelli was promoted to Sergeant. Everyone has adapted to their new roles tremendously.

Other Officers stepped into new roles as well. Officer Darryn Zupancic became the new School Resource Officer at the High School in September. Sgt. Carlos Crespo, Ptl. Ken Falzini, Ptl. Dave Simia, and Ptl. Mark Lee all were reassigned to the newly created Targeted Enforcement Unit in June. Officer Brittany Crespo took over the Community Engagement Program for our department and put together numerous successful events with our community.

I continue to be impressed with the work our officers do on a daily basis. The job of Police Officer has become an increasingly difficult one with the nationwide increase in crime over the past few years. Yet our Officers continue to answer the call to duty and are willing to do whatever it takes to protect our community from those seeking to do harm. The high character and professionalism with which they conduct themselves is exemplary. I am incredibly blessed to be part of this team and work along side them on a daily basis. Thank you.

## PATROL DIVISION

- The Patrol Division consists of 28 Patrolmen divided among 4 shifts with a Lieutenant and Sergeant on each shift.
- Patrol Officers are responsible for responding to calls for service, responding to accidents, enforcing traffic laws, and general assistance calls.
- Patrol Officers work 12-hour shifts and are on permanent “days” or “nights”.
- The minimum officers required on the road at anytime is five.

# DETECTIVE BUREAU

## Adult Cases



# TARGETED ENFORCEMENT UNIT

## TEU Overview

The City of Garfield Heights Police Department has incepted a Targeted Enforcement Unit consisting of a four Officer team, three patrolmen and one supervisor. The Targeted Enforcement Unit (TEU), has a goal of curtailing the current uptick trend of violent crimes and weapon offenses in the city. This four-person team in the Police Department uses crime analysis software to compile data to locate and identify where resources in the unit will best be utilized, to increase the quality of life for surrounding residents ,as well as creating a safer Garfield Heights. The City of Garfield Heights has experienced a heavy increase in violent crimes/ weapons offenses, and TEU has taken a proactive approach to making arrests of individuals whom commit crimes in Garfield Heights or come to Garfield Heights with the intention of committing crimes. TEU takes this task on as a group effort working in conjunction with agencies on the state/federal level as well as with residents to gather information and work towards the common goal of creating a safe Garfield Heights.

## SOUTH EAST AREA LAW ENFORCEMENT (SEALE)



We are one of seven agencies in the Southeast Area Law Enforcement regional group.

- We have the following number of members allocated to each:

# SCHOOL PARTNERSHIP

## School Resource Officer (SRO)

In 2022, the Garfield Heights High School welcomed Patrolman Darryn Zupancic as their new School Resource Officer. Darryn came to our Department in 2022 as a lateral transfer from Maple Heights PD where he had over ten years of prior law enforcement experience. Darryn is responsible for many things at the High School including security, counseling, educational presentations, and organizing event security. Darryn also visits other GH Schools to meet with kids there as well. He's been doing a fantastic job so far and we look forward to him serving in this position for years to come.



## School Protection and Effective Alert Response (SPEAR)



For the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year our department instituted a program started by Sgt. Nick Rossi called the SPEAR initiative. The purpose of this program is to focus more of our time on providing security for the three elementary schools in our city. Several officers on each day shift have been assigned to Mapleleaf, William Foster, and Elmwood schools. These officers are present at the schools during arrival, dismissal, lunch times, and recess. By having the same officers at the same schools, they can become more familiar with the daily routines and activities of their schools. The overall goal is to act as deterrent to anyone looking to harm the schools or students in any way. The program has been a successful one and one we plan on continuing. Nothing is more important than the safety and well-being of our children.


