AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO DO ALL THINGS NECESSARY TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT THE BUREAU OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION FIREFIGHTER EXPOSURE TO ENVIRONMENTAL ELEMENTS GRANT TO BE USED TO PURCHASE SAFETY EQUIPMENT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

*WHEREAS*, the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation ("BWC") has made available grant funding to local municipalities through the Firefighter Exposure to Environmental Elements Grant ("FEEEG") for the purposes of purchasing equipment that will improve the overall safety of on-duty firefighters; and

*WHEREAS*, under the terms of the FEEEG, the City of Garfield Heights is eligible to receive up to \$15,000 within a three-year cycle; and

*WHEREAS*, ~~this grant does not contain a match requirement from the City; accordingly, any funding received will be at no cost to the City~~ this grant contains a match requirement in the amount of twenty-percent (20%); accordingly, the total cost to the City would not exceed \$3,000.00; and

*WHEREAS*, the City would like to apply for the FEEEG in order to purchase forty-five (45) pairs of Flame Gloves and forty-five (45) BarriAire Gold Complete Coverage Hoods.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to apply for and accept the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation FEEEG in order to purchase forty-five (45) pairs of Flame Gloves and forty-five (45) BarriAire Gold Complete Coverage Hoods (quote attached hereto as Exhibit A), at a cost not to exceed \$3,000.00.

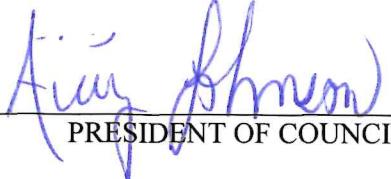

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO DO ALL THINGS NECESSARY TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND UTILIZE THE 2024 DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, each year, the Department of Justice makes funding available to local law enforcement by way of the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant ("JAG"); and

WHEREAS, in 2024, the City of Garfield Heights Police Department is eligible to receive up to \$14,901.00 in funding; and

WHEREAS, funds received via the JAG grant may be utilized for additional personnel and/or the purchase of equipment, supplies, contractual support, training, technical assistance, and information systems for criminal justice or civil proceedings.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. The Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to apply for, accept, and utilize the 2024 Department of Justice Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant.

SECTION 2. The Finance Director is hereby authorized and directed to issue her vouchers of the City for the purpose set forth in Section 1. hereof, said amounts to be charged to the appropriate fund (s), upon completion of the normal purchase order system purchasing requirements.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING SECTION 541.12 – “*INTERMENT OF THE DEAD*,” OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, on September 25, 2023, this Council passed Resolution 20-2023, imposing a moratorium on family cemeteries as defined in Ohio Revised Code Section 4767.02 on residential property within the City of Garfield Heights (“City”); and

WHEREAS, after careful consideration of all potential public health, safety, and welfare impacts resulting from the establishment of family cemeteries on residential property, this Council has determined it necessary to establish rules and regulations for interment of the dead within the City.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS, OHIO THAT:

**SECTION 1.** Section 541.12 – “*Interment of the Dead*” of the Codified Ordinances shall be established to read as follows:

**541.12 – INTERMENT OF THE DEAD**

Interment of the dead within the City of Garfield Heights is prohibited, except at cemeteries registered with the Division of Real Estate of the Ohio Department of Commerce as of the date of the passage of this ordinance. A body buried within the City in violation of this section shall be taken up by order of the Mayor and buried in compliance with the law. The cost of taking up, removing, and reburying any such body shall be borne by the person who is responsible for the unlawful burial.

Whoever violates or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor for a first offense; for a second offense, such person is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree; for a third or subsequent offense, such person shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree. Whoever is convicted of or pleads guilty to a misdemeanor, or minor misdemeanor, shall be sentenced in accordance with Section 501.99. A separate offense shall be deemed committed each day during or on which a violation or noncompliance occurs or continues.

**SECTION 2.** Council declares this Ordinance to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon the adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS FOR ISSUE 50, A RENEWAL LEVY PROPOSED BY THE GARFIELD HEIGHTS CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF EDUCATION

*WHEREAS*, the Garfield Heights City School District Board of Education (“GHCS”) has placed Issue 50 on the November 2024 ballot, which is a renewal levy that will not increase taxes, but maintain funding levels for normal and routine district operations for the next 10 years; and

*WHEREAS*, Issue 50 represents the combined renewal of two levies that have been continuously approved by voters in our community every five years since 1986 and 1992, respectively; and

*WHEREAS*, the term of Issue 50 would be 10 years, lengthening the renewal period to help create long-term financial stability for GHCS; and

*WHEREAS*, funds generated by Issue 50 will be used for the same items they have been since the levy was first introduced - core educational programming, purchasing learning materials, ensuring building safety and security, maintain and improving technology, equipment, and resources, and paying other operating expenses; and

*WHEREAS*, if the levy fails, GHCS would have an approximate \$5.35 million shortfall, and be forced into a series of cuts and potential layoffs that would severely compromise the delivery of education in our school district; and

*WHEREAS*, GHCS has made public certain cuts that would be necessary if Issue 50 were to fail, including cuts to general transportation for students in Grades 2-8, cuts to various educational programs and resources, the cutting of up to 50 staff positions, and the elimination of free extra-curricular activities in lieu of pay-to-play programming.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio, that:

**SECTION 1.** The Mayor and Council of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio hereby endorses the passage by voters in the November 2024 General Election of Issue 50, a renewal levy proposed by the Garfield Heights City School District Board of Education.

**SECTION 2.** The Mayor and Council of the City of Garfield Heights ask the residents of Garfield Heights to join its members in supporting the passage of Issue 50, as a strong school district fosters a strong community.
