AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE FINANCE DIRECTOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, TO SUBMIT PAYMENT TO THE CUYAHOGA SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT AND NORTHEAST OHIO REGIONAL SEWER DISTRICT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT AND PUBLIC EDUCATION REGARDING SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, in Ordinance, 03-2021, to ensure Environmental Protection Agency compliance, this Council authorized the City of Garfield Heights ("City") to enter into a contract with the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District ("SWCD") and Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District ("NEORS") for the implementation of educational, stewardship, and public involvement activities regarding soil and water conservation measures for the years 2021-2025; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the aforementioned contract, the City is required and the Council now authorizes the Finance Director to submit payment in the amount of six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00) to the SWCD and NEORS for the continuation of this program in 2025, a cost which is reimbursable through the NEORS.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS, OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1. The Finance Director or her designee is hereby authorized and directed to submit payment to SWCD and NEORS for year 2025, the fee for services provided to not exceed six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00); under the terms of the agreement the full \$6,000 cost to the city is reimbursable through NEORS.

SECTION 2. The Finance Director is hereby authorized and directed to issue her vouchers for the City, to be charged to the appropriate fund for the purposes set forth in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 3. Council declares this Ordinance to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effective immediately upon the adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING SECTION 1311.24 –
“*TEMPORARY STORAGE BIN/BOX/DUMPSTER APPLICATION AND FEE*,” OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF
GARFIELD HEIGHTS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, after careful review of the City of Garfield Heights (“City”) Building Code, the Building Commissioner has deemed it necessary to update the code so that it can better serve the needs of the community.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS, OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1. Section 1311.24 – “*Temporary Storage Bin/Box/Dumpster Application and Fee*” of the Codified Ordinances shall be established to read as follows:

1311.24 – TEMPORARY STORAGE BIN/BOX/DUMPSTER APPLICATION AND FEE

No owner or operator of any premises shall maintain or permit to be maintained at or on the exterior property areas of such premises any portable/temporary/storage bin/box or dumpster until the owner or operator:

- (a) Files an application with the City of Garfield Heights Building Department for the placement of the temporary storage bin/box/dumpster; and
- (b) Submits a fee of \$100 to the City for the placement of the temporary storage bin/box/dumpster on a specific premise prior to such placement.

No more than one temporary storage bin/box/dumpster shall be located on any such premises. Any application granted by the Building Department under this section shall be valid for 30 days. Upon said owner or operator’s written request, one 30-day extension may be granted at the Building Commissioner’s discretion. Any further extensions shall incur an additional \$100 monthly fee.

SECTION 2. Council declares this Ordinance to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon the adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 1. Section 1313.04 – Fees of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Garfield Heights, Ohio, shall be amended to read as follows (**bold** indicates new language, ~~strikethrough~~ indicates language to be removed):

1313.04 FEES.

(a) The fee charged for the Certificate of Inspection shall be **two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for a dwelling structure and three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for a commercial building structure.** ~~one hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$125.00) for the first dwelling unit or structure and an additional forty dollars (\$40.00) for each additional unit in such structure.~~

(b) A re-inspection fee of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) shall be charged for each re-inspection after the first two re-inspections, to be paid by the owner of the property at the time of the issuance of the Certificate of Compliance.

(c) A property owner who fails to appear at the scheduled inspection time and date agreed to at the time the application for a certificate of inspection is filed with the City shall be charged a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), unless said property owner provides the Building Department with one full business days' notice of cancellation of the appointment.

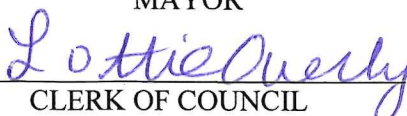

WHEREAS, after careful review of the City of Garfield Heights (“City”) Housing Code, the Building Commissioner has deemed it necessary to update Section 1413.01 – “*Certificate of Occupancy*” so that the costs associated with obtaining a Certificate of Occupancy in the City better reflect current competitive pricing.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD HEIGHTS, OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1. Section 1413.01 – “*Certificate of Occupancy*” of the Codified Ordinances shall be amended to read as follows (**bold** indicates new language, ~~strikethrough~~ indicates language to be removed):

1413.01– CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY.

(a)(1) As used in this Housing Code, “rental unit” means any dwelling unit or rented room within a single-family, duplex and two-family dwelling, and the third floor of a two-family dwelling, where either of the following conditions exists:

A. Consideration in the form of money or other valuable consideration is being paid for occupying such rental units; or

B. A person other than the owner of the property is occupying such dwelling unit, whether or not such person is paying consideration. This section does not apply to immediate family members limited to: father, mother, daughter and son of owner, or spouse of owner.

(2) The term “rental unit” does not include a room for rent in a hotel as defined in Section 1121.20 of the Zoning Code.

(b) No person shall occupy, and no owner or resident agent shall permit a person to occupy, a rental unit, unless the Building Commissioner has issued to the owner or resident agent a Certificate of Occupancy for such rental unit.

(c)(1) Application for a Certificate of Occupancy shall be made separately for each rental unit (no later than January 31st of each calendar year, otherwise, a late fee of **one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00)** ~~twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)~~ will be assessed) by supplying necessary information to determine compliance with applicable laws, ordinances, rules and regulations for the existing use or occupancy or the intended use or occupancy on forms supplied by the Building Commissioner. Such information shall include, but need not be limited to, the following:

A. The name, address and telephone number of the owner of the property;

B. The name, address and telephone number of the resident agent of the property if one is required by Section 1409.03(b);

C. The address of the property and the number of rental units contained within the property;

D. The current name, address, business and/or home telephone number, and date of birth

of the persons who, since the last application, have been occupying the rental unit, and the address or other identification of the rental unit which they occupied;

E. The familial relationship, if any, among the persons listed in subsection (c)(1)D. hereof;

F. In the case of a third floor rental unit, a statement that no person who occupies the third floor rental unit stores, cooks or otherwise prepares food in the third floor rental unit or other common area; that such activities shall not be permitted; and that appliances or equipment which are used for such activities are not being provided or permitted on the premises;

G. The name of the head of the household of each rental unit;

H. A statement that the information is necessary for tax purposes; and

I. Such other information as may be requested on a voluntary basis.

(2) The Building Commissioner may revoke a Certificate of Occupancy if any false statement appears in the application or if the information contained in the application is inaccurate.

(d)(1) Every application for a Certificate of Occupancy or a renewal thereof shall be accompanied by an application fee of **two hundred dollars (\$200.00)**. ~~one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the first unit and twenty five dollars (\$25.00) for each additional unit.~~

(2) A Certificate of Occupancy shall be renewed annually, no later than January 31st.

(3) An application for renewal of a Certificate of Occupancy shall be submitted to the Building Commissioner no earlier than thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date of the certificate and no later than January 31st, otherwise a late fee of **one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00)** ~~twenty five dollars (\$25.00)~~ will be assessed.

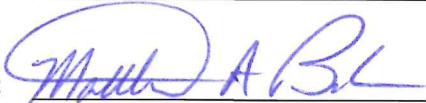

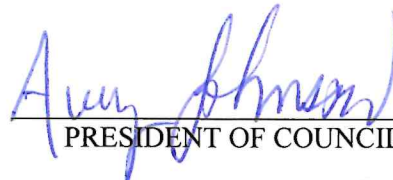

SECTION 3.
