OTHER DISPOSAL OPTIONS

- **Batteries**

- Dispose of single-use (non-rechargeable) alkaline batteries (AA, AAA, C, D, etc.) in the regular trash.
- Rechargeable batteries (Lithium Ion, Nickle Cadmium, etc.) can be recycled at hardware, home improvement or electronics retail stores near you. Batteries+Bulbs stores also accept these for a small fee.
- Lead acid (vehicle) batteries can be recycled at a scrap metal yard. You may receive a rebate.

- **Latex Paint.** Latex paint is 99% water and 1% rubber and is safe to dispose with your household trash when it is dried out. Dry out your latex paint by exposing it to the air, mixing in a drying agent like cat litter or Oil-Dri, then place it in a regular trash bag and put it out with your weekly rubbish collection.

- **Fire Extinguishers.** Empty contents into a bag and throw away the bag and any plastic on the extinguisher. Metal extinguishers can be taken to a scrap metal yard.

- **Fluorescent Bulbs.** Compact fluorescent bulbs (small, twisty CFLs) can be recycled for free at Lowe's. Look for a drop box near the main entrance or customer service desk. Some local Batteries+Bulbs retail stores will accept and recycle all types of bulbs and ballasts, including fluorescent tubes. Stores are in Akron, Macedonia, Mayfield Heights, and Parma. A small disposal fee will apply.

- **Medications.** Rx drop boxes are available at police stations throughout Cuyahoga County. Seasonal collection events are conducted by the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District, U.S. DEA and local retail stores.

- **Propane Tanks and Cylinders**

- Drop off 20# grill tanks at any Blue Rhino location and write “For Recycling” on the tank.
- Small tanks for camp stoves, lanterns, etc. can be emptied by burning them on whatever they are designed for and take the metal to a scrap metal yard.
- Helium tanks should be emptied and punctured per the instructions that came with the tank. Recycle at a scrap yard.

By law, business waste cannot be disposed of through the Household Hazardous Waste Program. Businesses with hazardous waste should contact the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District for a list of companies that can assist with disposal. Call (216) 443-3749 for a recommendation.
